REDWOOD EDUCATORS CONFERENCE SESSION INFORMATION (Saturday, April 27th)

8:30-10AM

- A. <u>Obstacles to Association Involvement</u> (EMLD) This training session examines difficulties experienced by minority members in becoming successfully involved in association activities and programs. There are discussions dealing with stereotyping and other obstacles.
- B. <u>Unconscious Bias</u>(HR) Social psychologists and social scientists have found that all of us, regardless of race, have cognitive biases that influence how we perceive and make decisions about our students. The behavior of human beings is often guided by racial and other stereotypes of which we are completely unaware. This training will explore the shortcuts and subsequent perceptions we make about people and our surroundings. It will also provide tools to increase awareness about our cognitive biases and offer intervention strategies.
- A. <u>Transitioning to the Common Core State Standards—Language Arts and Mathematics (IPD)</u> The session provides an overview of the Common Core State Standards. Participants will review and discuss differences between the new standards and the current California Content Standards.
- D. <u>Gender, Race, and CTA (WI)</u> Examine the multicultural, gender equity and behavioral characteristics of women and men leaders.

10:15-11:45AM

- A. <u>Gang Awareness (HR)</u> No longer strictly a problem of the inner city, gangs are pervasive across all ethnic, gender, socioeconomic and geographic boundaries in California. This workshop provides information about youth gangs in California, and more importantly, why students join. The role of teachers and schools in gang intervention is thoroughly discussed. This workshop also provides a segment for developing a plan of action for participants, schools, and communities.
- B. <u>Stressed? (WI)</u>- Learn helpful "tips" for managing in all aspects of your daily life. Discover how life changes and your behavior impact your stress level.
- C. <u>Education Support Professionals</u> (ESP)- Issues of importance to ESP members will be presented and discussed.
- D. <u>The New California Assessments: SMARTER Balanced Assessment (IPD)</u>—This session provides an overview and an update of SMARTER Balanced Assessment's and work toward development of new California Assessments. These new assessments are scheduled to be administered during the 2014-2015 school year. The Superintendent of Public Instruction is recommending STAR, as we know it, to be suspended.

1:00-2:30PM

- A. <u>Empowerment for Leaders (EMLD)</u>- Focuses on the definition of power and how leaders use power to achieve their goals within the association. Attention is given to campaign strategies.
- B. <u>Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual & Transgender Youth: Breaking the Silence</u> (HR) As students struggle to deal with gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender issues, educators need factual information so they can correct the misinformation about homosexuality. This training will provide participants with strategies for reducing hostilities towards gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender students and learn ways to create a safe learning environment for all students. In addition, participants will learn what their Chapters and Service Centers can do to promote tolerance and understanding of these issues.
- C. <u>Are you Listening? (WI)</u> Learn to use attending, observing, and listening skills in order to become a responsive leader.
- D. <u>CalSTRS Workshop (CalSTRS)-</u> Come join us for an in-depth review of the CalSTRS Defined Benefit that you earn every day you work as an educator. Topics to be covered include the DB formula, the DBS account, CalSTRS counseling service, Social Security Offsets, current and past legislation, and the retirement reform legislation. Members are encouraged to come even if they are not planning to retire for several years. Teachers in their first five years of teaching will benefit from this workshop as much as those in their last five years. Come one, come all, it's your retirement!
