4) - President's report – Moira was absent, but the following issues were discussed:

- Sierra Vista Update Mike reported on the process of reopening the school and how it would be impacting our community. Hiring will start in early 2016. The report finished with a discussion of some other potential problems with re-opening the school and how we might work, collaboratively, to ensure a successful reopening. VUSD is looking to slightly overstaff for the first year of the reopening. The report finished with a few questions.
- *Sub Pay Issue* Brenda discussed the issue and detailed the changes from the recently signed sub pay MOU, which can be found here http://www.vacateachers.org/sub-pay-mou
- *PD/Trainings after the duty day* are optional and time sheeted. Site based trainings, however, are part of the 24 staff meeting hours per year.
- *Elementary Report Card changes* Some tweaking was done to report cards after the year began. This caused extra work to teachers who had already set up gradebooks, given grades and sent progress reports. Moira has contacted ed services, they acknowledged the concern, and said this will not happen again. Members are urged to use internet explorer for imputing grades.

- *Health Care* Alyson reported that open enrollment is closed, but health care estimates will not be prepared until December 1st to ensure the most accurate numbers. The report finished with a general discussion of the outlook for health care costs for 2016 and how the will of the membership must drive this process forwards.
