Memorandum of Understanding Between the Vacaville Unified School District and the Vacaville Teachers Association

Amendments to the Reopening for Red/Orange Tiers MOU CHANGES TO ELEMENTARY

Delete Original Language:

Starting Dates for In-Person Instruction by grade level (Subject to change, depending on county tier):

November 16, 2020: Some SPED classes (FA, TAP, PERL, SDC Elementary)

December 1, 2020: Pre-school, TK, K, 1st grade, 2nd grade

January 4, 2021: 3rd through 12th grades

If the county goes back into the purple tier before a grade level is reopened, then that grade level shall stay at 100% distance learning, except for self-contained special education classes (FA, TAP, PERL, SCIL, SDC). If the county goes back into the red tier (from purple), the District may return to in-person instruction after three weeks in the red tier.

Change Language to:

We have two paths to reopen in-person learning for Elementary: <u>Purple Path</u> and <u>Red Path</u>. Schools will reopen for in-person learning following whichever pathway leads to in-person learning first.

Purple Path <u>OR</u>	Red Path
If the county remains in the purple tier and under 25:100K case rate, then we will return to in-person learning one week after a second dose of a two-dose COVID vaccine or four weeks after a single dose of a single-dose COVID vaccine has been made available to unit members through Solano County Public Health. The reopening date timeline will be determined by when Solano County Public Health gives unit	As long as the county remains in the purple tier, schools shall stay at 100% distance learning, except for self-contained special education classes (FA, TAP, PERL, SCIL, SDC). If the county goes back into the red tier (by the numbers) from purple, the District may return to in-person instruction after three weeks in the red tier (by the numbers). Red Tier (by the numbers) is defined as "red tier numbers in Test Positivity and Adjusted Case Rate for Tier Assignment".

VTA and the District will meet weekly to discuss county COVID numbers. The District will communicate the status of these numbers to unit members on a weekly basis.

Unit members, that have been required to instruct, assess and/or monitor students in-person, shall be paid \$100.00 per week for each week they have been doing this work in the purple tier, before TK-6 opens fully.

Delete Original Language:

100% Distance Learning Students (Elementary):

The classroom teacher that is teaching in-person classes shall not be required to teach 100% distance learning students, unless teacher consent and VTA approval. All provisions of the Phase 1 MOU shall be maintained for those unit members providing 100% Distance Learning.

The District shall make reasonable effort to mitigate the number of combination classes for 100% distance learning classes, including, but not limited to, combining distance learning classes between schools.

Short-Term Independent Study Students (Elementary):

The classroom teacher that is teaching in-person classes shall not be responsible for providing 100% distance learning for those students on their roster that go out on short-term independent study for any reason. Short-term independent study packets/assignments will continue as past practice.

Change Language to:

Each grade level of teachers at each site shall collaborate on how to deliver instruction to in-person and 100% virtual students. They shall use these parameters to create a plan for their grade level:

- -must follow the AM/PM model time constraints previously bargained
- -medical accommodations for teachers shall be adhered to
- -minimize class roster changes
- -household/sibling AM/PM designations
- -flexibility for students who need to change instructional models for COVID purposes

- -maintain COVID safety protocols outlined in the Red/Orange Tier MOU and the District's Health and Wellness Plan
- -Short-term Independent Study students (for purposes for other than COVID or medical reasons) may be accommodated by packets, online asynchronous work and/or virtual lessons if available
- -All provisions of the Phase 1 MOU shall be maintained for those unit members providing 100% Distance Learning (and no in-person instruction)

If a grade level at a site cannot come to a resolution about how to deliver instruction one week after receiving family choice data, the grade level team shall meet with a site/district administrator and a VTA representative to work it out.

Dual Delivery pay (\$200.00 per week) shall be paid to those unit members who are instructing similar lessons in two different models (in-person and virtual).

Additions:

The District shall develop a single form for unit members to use to refer students for mental health
services. Training on the form shall be given to unit members during the transition week to in-persor
learning.

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
